





ADDRESS OVERPOPULATION

Overpopulation is a pervasive issue. On average, 6.3 million companion animals enter shelters every year. Only 3.2 million of those are adopted, and 1.5 million are euthanized because animal shelters can no longer sustain them. There are an estimated 70 million stray cats and dogs living in the US.

PROVIDE EDUCATION AND SUPPORT

Education and support contribute to sustainable solutions for animal welfare. By teaching pet owners and future generations about compassion, empathy, and responsible stewardship of pet care, we lay the foundation for a society that values and protects animals for years to come.

FOSTERING AND ADOPTION

Fostering pets in high-risk situations, such as neglect, abuse, or abandonment provides a safe haven and necessary care to pets in crisis. Foster care gives pets a second chance at life and saves them from euthanasia in overcrowded shelters.

KEEPING ANIMALS WITH FAMILIES

Families often struggle to provide adequate care for their pets, leading to multiple generations of cats and dogs without access to essential services and healthcare. This is not due to a lack of love, but because of insufficient resources and understanding of preventative care.

By providing wrap around services, it is our belief that we can keep animals with their families and out of shelters and rescues.



Meet Chico, a one-year-old Pomeranian mix whose journey was marked by terrible cruelty. Chico was victim to a shocking act of violence – his front legs were intentionally broken by a teenager.

The breaks caused Chico immense pain and left his future uncertain. Despite this awful crime, Chico's story is not one of despair but of resilience and hope.

Due to financial struggles, Chico's owners couldn't afford the extensive medical treatment needed to help him. While his legs were initially splinted and he received some veterinary care, surgery was necessary for him to have a better quality of life. Without intervention from the team at Hodes Veterinary Health Center, Chico risked losing both front legs, a fate we couldn't let him face. The WAAL Warrior community rallied together, offering support and giving Chico a second chance. Chico received the vital surgery he needed, and together, we made a difference. Today, Chico is thriving. Thanks to caring individuals, the teenager faced legal consequences.

WAAL proudly operates a foster-home-based model, providing a nurturing environment for animals at risk of euthanasia in local shelters. Our dedicated network of foster families ensures every animal receives the love, care, and attention they deserve until their forever families are found. Additionally, our rehoming services work to match animals with suitable adopters, effectively preventing pets from entering the shelter system. WAAL ensures that each animal's journey from rescue to adoption is filled with compassion, support, and the promise of a brighter future.

SPAY IT FORWARD

Every day, countless puppies and kittens are brought into this world across the US. Whether it's the result of profit-driven breeding or owners simply wanting their pets to experience parenthood, the outcome often leads to a surplus of animals without enough loving homes to go around.

At WAAL, we recognize that one of the most effective ways to address the heartbreaking issue of overpopulation is by prioritizing spaying and neutering in our community. It's not just about preventing unwanted litters; it's about preventing neglect and cruelty before it happens. When families lack the financial means or preparation for unexpected litters, animals can suffer greatly. That is why our Spay It Forward program is so vital. By offering affordable spay and neuter services, we are tackling the root cause of unnecessary pet euthanasia and promoting responsible pet ownership. Several times a month, we host Spay/Neuter clinics. These clinics are staffed by licensed veterinarians and fully equipped, allowing us to reach low income communities. By bringing these services directly to the community, we make it easier for pet owners to do their part in controlling overpopulation while also alleviating the burden on shelters and reducing the likelihood of animals facing mistreatment or abandonment. At the time of surgery, we also vaccinate, and provide basic grooming like clipping the nails, and cleaning ears.

WHY IS SPAYING & NEUTERING SO IMPORTANT?

CATS can get pregnant when they are 4 months old and have **3 LITTERS A YEAR!**



DOGS can get pregnant when they are 5 months old and have **2 LITTERS A YEAR!**



90% of pets entering shelters are not fixed!

According to the ASPCA, approximately 7.6 million companion animals enter shelters nationwide every year. Each year approximately 2.7 million animals are euthanized.

Spaying and Neutering pets is the number one way we can combat this!


COMMUNITY OUTREACH

WAAL's impact extends far beyond just rescuing and rehoming animals. We are committed to being on the front lines, actively engaging in the welfare of animals in our community. This means that when reports of neglect or cruelty are made, we respond.

During the summer months, our efforts may involve ensuring that animals have access to shade and water to keep them safe and comfortable in the heat. Similarly, on the coldest and windiest days, our dedicated team is out in the field, providing homes, straw, and educating pet owners on appropriate animal care practices to ensure that no pet suffers due to harsh weather conditions.

Beyond the basic needs, we investigate cruelty and neglect concerns. We also provide emergency rescue, assist with vet bills, and empower the community with vaccination and supply clinics. We are always respectful and do not judge. Our goal is to help pets in crisis.

COMMUNITY FOOD BANKS


As part of our commitment to ensuring no pet goes hungry, the Wichita Animal Action League collaborates with five local food banks to offer complimentary pet food. Our devoted team distributes roughly 200,000 pounds of dog and cat food annually. Often, a simple bag of food is all that stands between a struggling family and the ability to care for their beloved pet.



PETS FOR LIFE PROGRAM 2023 SUCCESSES

PFL takes a comprehensive, long-term approach to addressing the lack of access to pet resources people experience in underserved communities through door-to-door community outreach and pet owner support services.

Providing free veterinary care, supplies, services and information to pet owners, the program builds trust and positive relationships within the communities that are served.



PETS FOR LIFE

PFL is a program designed to keep the animals from low income areas in their homes, out of the shelters, and give their owners access to FREE pets resources, when available!

We believe that by offering these resources and spreading knowledge about responsible pet ownership, we can help bridge the gap between systemic inequality for all pet related areas. PFL focuses on building trust and a relationship with pet owners and is currently operating in the Planeview community only and WAAL is the only rescue in the State of Kansas to offer the PFL program.

SHARON & MILO

Our Pets for Life team member met Sharon and her dog Mojo last year. Mojo had a grapefruit size tumor hanging from his chest.

Mojo had lived with the tumor for several years because Sharon did not have the means to seek medical treatment. She tried to get help through several other organizations, but no one followed through. When our representative knocked on Sharon's door to introduce WAAL and our Pets for Life program, Sharon broke down in tears.

Several weeks later, Mojo had his tumor removed. He is now fully healed and back to his happy and healthy self... minus a one pound tumor on his chest.

A.L.P.H.A.

This clinic stands apart from our vaccine, spay/neuter, and routine check-up clinics. Its focus is squarely on addressing health issues requiring immediate medical attention, such as ear infections, lacerations, eye infections, skin conditions, and more. Here, not only are treatments administered, but medications are also provided as part of the service.

ALPHA's commitment to addressing these urgent health concerns significantly enhances the well-being of our cherished pets. The gratitude expressed by their owners is profound and heartfelt. Without ALPHA, essential treatments for these conditions would simply not be accessible.



- Identities are always anonymous.
- Participants do not pay anything for their pet while they are receiving services including medical care for their pets if needed.
- They will always be reunited with their pet.



SAFE PAWS ALLIANCE PROGRAM

The Wichita Animal Action League Safe Paws Alliance (SPA) Program provides safe housing to pets of owners who are facing domestic violence or veterans who need to enter inpatient treatment. This ensures everyone's safety and wellbeing, at no cost to the owner.

This program is a partnership with Harbor House, Wichita Family Crisis Center, Midwest Battle Buddies and the Robert J. Dole VA Hospital.

This program is available to any person receiving services from the above mentioned partners. If you need boarding for your pet while you are receiving services, please ask your program representative and they will contact us. For safety and anonymity reasons we do not have direct contact with owners.
